As the 1st quarter comes to an end, it is natural to see students, parents, and teachers concerned about academic progress. Although we want to see our students do their absolute best, please remember that 1st quarter progress reports are a snapshot in time. It gives parents, teachers, and students an opportunity to make adjustments if needed.

### Fall Parent Teacher Conferences

Fall parent teacher conferences will be held on October 16th and 18th from 4-8 pm on both nights. Teachers will be located in the cafeteria and gymnasium areas. Conferences are staggered between the different levels between elementary, middle, and high school. Although we know certain circumstances may arise, please try to adhere to the suggested times as much as possible.

### MAP Testing

WMS recently administered the Math, Reading, and Science MAP Tests. The MAP test will be administered three times during an academic school year, giving WMS data that can be used to drive instruction and provide interventions for struggling students. The results from the fall testing will be shared during Parent Teacher Conferences, along with the grade reports for the 1st quarter.

### Gallup Student Poll

Beginning Thursday, October 19th, the WMS Counseling Department will be coordinating the Gallup Student Poll as part of a District-Wide effort to measure hope, engagement, entrepreneurial aspirations and career/financial literacy. The 24 items in the Gallup Student Poll measure several dimensions of student success, including engagement with school, hope for the future, entrepreneurial aspiration and career/financial literacy. Administered during SPARK, the survey is part of our building goal of student engagement. Armed with this new and ongoing research, parents and school districts can pursue student success goals with proven and actionable data that can lead to significant improvements.
